



AtomJump Messaging the original kitset messaging







Problem

A single commercially-motivated organisation today controls the majority of our online social and messaging experience, worldwide.

However, one size does not fit all. Political systems are at risk through the rapid proliferation of misinformation, and our basic human values are being compromised (results: increased mental health issues, violence)

We need a better open-source and non-profit alternative, that we can collectively mould ourselves to meet our own needs.





Solution

The AtomJump Foundation publishes a free open-source messaging solution that can be adapted and enhanced with user-created plugins.

Entry-level web developers can build on top of it and tailor it to their needs.





Advantages


Because the tool can be adapted rapidly to changing social issues, we quickly implemented new solutions to online hate-speech and misinformation.

Net result: On AtomJump.com, any user can now delete any other user's messages, anonymously. So only messages that are worthwhile will stay on a forum.

But, you don't need to keep this policy for your own installations, if you don't like it!

Traction

Early stages: we have integrated the software with our own medical app, MedImage, and have our first paying customer using this integration.

Internally, we use the tool instead of apps such as Teams or Slack, and externally we communicate with customers directly on our own website via AtomJump.

The core developer's background: 30+ years in search, graphics, open-source, mapping





Business model

Software: free and open source

We charge for optional hosted solutions (Software-as-a-Service)

Basic private rooms: NZ\$15 / year, approx US\$10 / year

Basic public rooms: free





Investment

The Foundation does not have shares, shareholders or outside investors, in order to remain financially and culturally independent. It is funded by product sales, only.

However: it accepts hardware donations

Opportunities also exist for 'finder's fees' on new large-scale customer installations for the Foundation.





What is the tech?

Developed largely with PHP, and some optional NodeJS, when higher performance is needed.

Security-wise:

- messages are encrypted between the browser and server.
- but have purposefully not been "end-to-end encrypted"
- i.e. messages remain on a central server, which law enforcement can potentially access in an emergency.

With your own installation, you have the choice of who can access your server.
